Public right of way improvements between Ascot Way & Mill Lane

The section between Ascot Way and Grandfield Way is still outstanding but will be completed once agreement has been reached by LCC.

In response to a request from the Parish Council and as a result of concerns raised by the local school and concerned parents, LCC is looking into the installation of a traffic barrier on the road side at the Mill Lane end of the bridleway and has indicated it would be beneficial to provide a physical deterrent against cycling into the road. There is sufficient space for it not to impede horse riders or adapted bikes and would be an added safety feature. It would also prevent motorised vehicles using the bridleway which has occurred on at least one occasion and which has been reported to the police. Under s34(1) of the Road Traffic Act 1988 (as amended by the Countryside and Rights of Way Act 2000) it is a criminal offence to drive a mechanically propelled vehicle on a footpath, bridleway or restricted byway without lawful authority.

Photographic evidence may be uploaded to the report to assist with the investigations that will follow.

Overgrown Trees and Hedges

Parishioners are respectfully requested to trim back trees and hedges that are overhanging the pavements and highways. The County Council may serve

enforcement notices on homeowners if they do not remove overhanging foliage and branches that may cause a hazard to pedestrians on the pavements or cyclists on the cycle paths.
