<u>Public right of way improvements between</u> <u>Ascot Way & Mill Lane</u>

The work to reinstate and improve the public right of way between Grandfield Way and Mill Lane has reached completion though there are remedial works to be carried out to resolve the drainage issues that have been a problem on a small section.

The final stretch between Ascot Way and Grandfield Way will be completed shortly once the outstanding issues have been investigated and resolved.

The new shared bridleway is well used by horse riders, pedestrians, joggers, cyclists and as an alternative way for families to get to school or to take their daily exercise on a safe and accessible route without having to use the car. In response to a request from the Parish Council and as a result of concerns raised by the local school and concerned parents, LCC is looking into the installation of a traffic barrier on the road side at the Mill Lane end of the bridleway. It would be beneficial to providing a physical deterrent against cycling into the road. There is sufficient space for it not to impede horse

riders or adapted bikes and would be an added safety feature. It would also prevent motorised vehicles using the bridleway which has occurred on at least one occasion and which has been reported to the police. Under s34(1) of the Road Traffic Act 1988 (as amended by the Countryside and Rights of Way Act 2000) it is a **criminal offence** to drive a mechanically propelled vehicle on a footpath, bridleway or restricted byway without lawful authority.
