What is Safer Communities Leaders?

Safer Communities Leaders is a scheme facilitated by the Office of the Police and Crime Commissioner for Lincolnshire. Safer Communities Leaders are volunteers that act as the voice of young people across the county, capturing the views of other young people on crime, policing and community safety.

As a group, they will collate these views, highlight the key issues affecting young people, and develop recommendations to present directly to the Police and Crime Commissioner, Deputy Police and Crime Commissioner, Lincolnshire Police, and other key decision makers at a county-wide youth conference.

What are the benefits of becoming a Safer Communities Leader?

Being a Safer Communities Leader offers:

- A chance to influence real change and help shape safer communities for young people across Lincolnshire.
- Gain skills and experience for CVs, UCAS applications, or other future opportunities.
- Meet and work with like-minded young people from across Lincolnshire
- A unique and exclusive opportunity to share views directly with the Police and Crime Commissioner and other senior leaders in policing and community safety.

Safer Communities Advisers

In addition to Lincolnshire Safer Communities Leaders, the new sub-group- Lincolnshire Safer Communities Advisers help to create, challenge, and influence county-wide campaigns from partners such as the police. They will work in collaboration with the main group, as well as OPCC staff and other partners to ensure that the voice of young people is heard in the design of content aimed at them and their peers.

Safer Communities Advisers meetings are currently held every other month, on Microsoft Teams. This role is open to anybody between 14-21 who lives, works or studies in Lincolnshire, even if they are not a member of Lincolnshire Safer Communities Leaders.
